Fire Department Reports

Bradford – Chris Sandford – Went over the calls for the year 2022, talked about how 2,000 hours in service in areas. 33 ambulance calls, 30 fires. 377 hours on the ambulance and 107 hours on the fires for Bradford. 45 ambulances and 8 fires for Orange. The budget, why was the Fire Departments not notified of when they took place. What about the contract with the town and the departments.

Norma Burris – There was an ad in the paper, but I will inform you next time. Our lawyer is currently working on a new contract, and that should be out soon.

Chris- Should have been done before the budget was approved. We need to get going sooner than later. I just don't agree with hearing that Bradford was not up to par on protection. We are here and we give all that is asked for.

Highway Superintendent Report – John Rappleye – Wolverton Road needs a lot of work on that road. Soil and Water is going to be helping with some of the work. April is when the big work will take place, the pipe will be replaced; as well as, the head walls.

County Legislature – Gary Grey – Everything is going well, we are finishing up the year with 5% increase in sale taxes. Schuyler County got together with Schuyler Hospital, we now have the ambulance service up and running. There are three in the whole County, one is stationed in Tyrone, they are there 9am to 9pm. The 24-7 ambulance is in Watkins, and that all started mid-December. That storm in Buffalo, we sent out to help, and we did 50 runs for a day and a half.

Heather Waters – How are we settling the Union Contract? Is there on yet?

Norma – No there is not one at this time.

Heather – Second, before leaving office, in my mailbox I had a copy of a local law from 2006 about the Junk Law. Can you please tell me why that was in my mailbox before leaving?

Norma – I have no idea how that got there.

Heather – Just not sure why I would be the only one to get this put in my mailbox.

Tara Garcia – I just want to say thanks to Maryann for last month, we had a phone call and were able to get our building permit and start moving forward. Thomas, if our stuff did not come to you. I don't know what happened, Jeremy meet Norma over here and wrote a check, and we did pay for it. I know there are things being sent out, and the prior owner of the property got the letter and not us. When we asked why the prior owner got the letter, it was stated that the prior owner was still listed as the owner on the tax map. So, we talked to Tony Novon about it. Tony also talked about if something is sent to the owner, that something also needs to be sent to the tenant as well. We only got the copy from the prior own, so that is how we know about it. This has been going on for more than 60 days, but it only took a ten minute conversation and things are now taken care of, I just don't see how this all could change because we talked to someone different.

Maryann Friebis – I am not sure how that could happen, but I am just glad to help.

Tara – The thing is that some people can do as the please, and nothing is very taken accountable. You say that is what the board is for, but even five minutes ago you asking why don't some of you know information. I mean our agenda looks different than yours, this forth resolution is not on our agenda. Right now the only person who has helped me is Maryann, and Rick come to say, just so you know this is being taken care of. No one else has done anything to help, the Supervisor, form the video slams the door on me with me in the doorway, and stated she did not have to help me.

James Rose – I saw the video and did not see the door slam.

Tim Povoski – How is this productive, and what is the end result? What are you trying to get to. What can we do?

Tara – I want Norma to apologize for all that has been done so far, and put us through. Things just need to stop.

Tim – Norma if she feels like that is what she needs to move on, then that what should happen.

Norma – I do apologize for what has happened.

Tim – I am not trying to cause a rift in anything, we are just telling you that we all live here and we should all be pulling the same rope to help each other. I understand, there is nothing more disrespectful than each other doing it to each other. We all should be on the same level of respect, for people in the room and on the board. I sure mistakes were made, I make mistakes, we all do. We are not belittling anything you are saying, but we do need to move on. We are trying to make it better.

Tara – I agree with what you are saying, but she needs to make it better, I know you all want to, but at the end of the day, she has to start.

Tim – I promise you, there are already things that I disagree with her on, but we are willing to hold each other accountable. Lets just move forward with it. Lets try to address the problems this town faces. We need to try to get as many grants as we can. Lets try to help as many people as we can while doing it.

Gary Grey – Under Code enforcement what is Town Law 138?

Norma – That is the state saying we are required to have code enforcement.

Tara – I understand Orange does not have a set of codes, they follow the states code.

Gary – As so, I hope you take into consideration Ricks request to see that documents in advance of the meeting to be able to review what he would be voting on.

Norma – I just hope you know we did not get these a month ahead of time.

Gary – Ill take a wack at those resolutions, but I am sure if Rick knew what they where he would have voted for them.

Norma – He has the information.

Gary – It just sounds like they are getting them the night of the meeting. They can't absorb it in such a sort time.

Norma – I think I sent them Saturday.

Tim – I agree, I got them Saturday, and with what I do full time, I find it hard to print and read thought them in such a short time. Also, there is no reason they should not be on the website prior to the meeting as well.

Rick – All I am saying is that I need to be able to read them and see what is going on.

Norma – So do you think the Mitigation and Soil and Water had a month to wait?

Gary – Not the Soil and Water, that needed to be addressed right away.

Daron Miller – I just want to hear or get a commitment from the town board to use some of the RAPA money to help put in a pavilion and fence repair for the park in the form of a resolution and with a vote. Just so it is in the minutes.

Norma – We are still working on taking care of the other park problem. We just need to talk about more and see if we need more quotes.

Thomas – I know I can send out more to see what is out there.

Tim – Yeah three quotes should be enough.

Thomas – I understand that, but when you ask for a quote and you do not get anything back, I can't get one if I can't get one.

Tim – What about general contractors, you could have them give you a quote.

Thomas – I understand that, but right now we are just asking for material cost, I have a list of people who would be more willing to help build it, that is not the issue, just the material cost.

Heather – Is that to understand you are going to give funds because there would be no point getting them if your not willing to put any money up for the project.

Tim – I think that is really based on the cost of the project. We need to see at least three quotes.

Daron – But what is what we have been asking for a long time. We just want to know that some kind of funding will be there once we get things around. We need to know what we can work with first to see if the quotes fit the budgeted amount.

Thomas – So is now the time we can talk about summer swim?

Norma – We have tabled it, we do not even have the quote yet to know how to talk about it.

Thomas – I guess I just don't understand why we would stop doing our program.

Norma – Because there is a better program for the children of this community. Something that would Monday to Friday. I am sure parents would like it as well. It not going to be anymore money. It is just an option we are looking into.

Tim – If this is something that has been going on since 1979, there is a lot of community support behind this already. If we could share both ideas and see what everyone thinks then we should put it out there. Then have a public forum on it and see what happens.

Larry Baker – Did we not have money left over from the park in donations.

Norma – Yes, there is some money left over; however, we have information from the state that they want all that money, and then some. Because they sent all that money for the grant, and only \$13k is accounted for. So we have to work this out, Thomas has been leading that for right now to figure out what is or can be done to fix this.

Thomas – Yeah that is what I talked about earlier in the report. We are filling out more information to see what we can do. Time, people, etc. We want to show what has happened from start to finish. To end it we just need more support documentation to show what and how all the work was done.

The youth program has been added back in as well. If anyone would like to review the changes, please feel free to ask now.

Rick Hendrick – What about the truck payments?

Norma – You can see the interest and payment have been moved to show the correct budget line numbers per the Comptroller. DA9785.6 equipment principal payment.

Mel Horton – So the workmen’s compensation is being paid for by the town?

Norma – Yes, I changed that today from yesterday to show that change.

Mel – I just though the town would pay the for department for the insurance, and we wrote a check back to the town.

Norma – No, we pay it though our insurance. I thought the same thing as well.

Mel – Thank you for clearing that up.

Heather Waters – So the Assessor is only going to be \$15,000.

Norma – Yes, that number was given to us by the County.

Maryann Friebis – Yes, Heather, also the 8802.04G is the Grant expenditure, we have that in there for next year to pay out, but you will get that money back from the state as you submit your vouchers.
